KePhSARH-Quest 1.0



The KePhSARH-Quest 1.0 was a pioneering event that united pharmacy students and recent graduates from across Kenya. Its goal was to promote collaboration, celebrate diversity in the pharmacy profession, and enhance research skills through various challenges.

The competition consisted of two phases:

Phase 1: Online Test: Participants completed an online quiz assessing their basic research knowledge across relevant topics.

Phase 2: Proposal Writing: Top performers from the online test formed teams of four to write a research proposal, showcasing their skills and understanding of the pharmacy field.

Winners had the unique opportunity to present their proposals at the World Pharmacy Day 2024 celebration at Kenyatta University, gaining valuable exposure.

Overall, KephSarhQuest 1.0 was a tremendous success, highlighting the enthusiasm and talent of Kenya's pharmacy students and graduates while fostering collaboration and innovation in pharmacy research.

KePhSARH-Quest 1.0 Teams

Three teams reached the final round, each presenting remarkable research questions:

- **Group A: Investigating the Effectiveness of a Plant-Based Diet in Reducing Hypertension**
- **Group B: Analyzing the Dual Burden of Child Malnutrition in Kenya: A Systematic Review and Meta-Analysis**
- **Group C: Personalizing Medication to Enhance Treatment Outcomes for Multidrug-Resistant Tuberculosis Patients in Kenyan Medical Facilities**

Group C emerged as the winner, followed by Group B and then Group A. All teams delivered outstanding presentations. They are currently in the ethical review stage and aim to complete their research within the next year.

Conclusion

KEPhSA Research Hub has had a productive year (2023 -2024) with various activities to promote evidence-based practice by having early exposure to research.

We eagerly anticipate another successful year, with further advancements, opportunities for our members, and increased collaborations to drive the hub forward.

The results suggested that some types of exposure of students to research during undergraduate education may be associated with more positive attitudes and greater confidence in undertaking practice research. This finding is aligned with those from previous studies conducted with chiropractic^{26,27} and medical²⁵ undergraduates who possessed previous research experience. However, most participants in this study, either with or without research experience, indicated that they recognised the important role pharmacy practice research played in the profession which is consistent with findings among medical²⁵ and nursing^{28,29} students as well as community pharmacists. For example, pharmacists who had previous research experience were more likely to be motivated and interested in participating in all aspects of research, found the research experience rewarding and were more willing to do it again compared to those who had no previous research experience.⁵ Moreover, most pharmacists, either with or without previous research experience indicated that they recognised the value and importance of research towards advancing the profession.^{5,6,30,31}
